In the afternoon the students took part in a cooking workshop with Dijon mustard-based recipes and then drew water-based themes on the school's pedagogical shop-window.



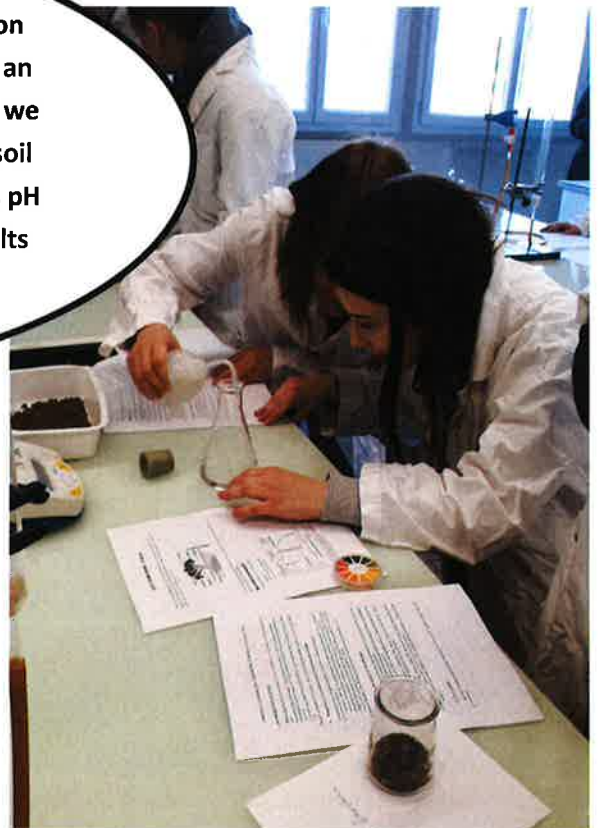
ERASMUS WEEK in France

In the afternoon, we presented and commented on various local produces produced and harvested in an environment-friendly way. Then, in the afternoon, we carried out a chemical study from the samples of soil we had collected from the vineyards to analyze its pH and water stress contents and we compared results and drew conclusions.



Today, we all spent the day in Dijon. We first visited the capital of the Dukes of Burgundy and its splendours on a 2-hour guided walkabout. The buildings were magnificent.

Day 4: 22nd March 2018



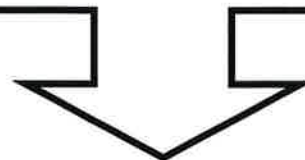

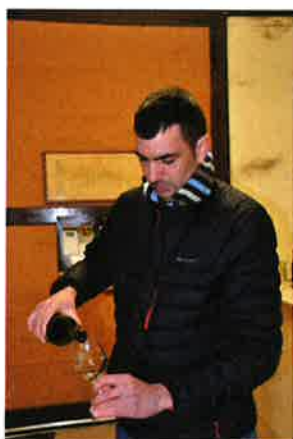
DOMAINE BAPTISTE GUYOT
